



## Monitor Selection Tips

With so many technologies on the market today, there are many ways to keep an eye and ear on your baby. Consider the following before choosing the right baby monitor for you.

### Parent's unit

- Some are big. Others are small. Some are wireless and clip to your belt. Some can be used indoors and outdoors. Some are so stylish that they look like works of art in your home instead of a baby monitor.

### One-way or two-way system

- One-way monitors allow you to hear your child, while a two-way monitor allows your child to hear you as well.

### Video monitors

- They come in black and white or color and help you to keep an eye on your baby. The majority of these units have an infrared camera so you can watch your baby even at night.

### Interference

- Look for a baby monitor that's fitted with more than one channel to help you deal with this problem. Look for a 900MHz monitor for added security and more privacy.

### Appropriate signal range

- Some monitors offer indoor/outdoor capability and can reach up to 900 feet.

### Convenience features

- Options like **room temperature indicators**, **low-power warning alerts** or even something as simple as **ease of use** can also help you make a decision.

### Car monitors

- Since the recommended place to have your baby while traveling in a car is in the back seat, there is now a video monitor that you can attach to your rear view mirror.

### Nanny cams

- You can always hook up an inexpensive webcam and watch the baby from your computer monitor. This will allow you to keep up with the baby's activities while doing your work on the computer.
